All governors receive training to help them carry out their role– we expect all our governors to complete induction training.

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Nominations must be from parents with children at the school on the day that nominations close. The enclosed sheet summarises the disqualification criteria to serve as a governor. Anyone standing for election must certify that they are not disqualified for any reason. All governors must apply for a DBS check. The school will arrange that.

If you would like to stand for election, please complete and sign the enclosed nomination form and return it to the school office no later than 12 noon on Friday 17th October 2025. You can nominate yourself. Please include a few details about yourself and why you would like to become a governor. This will then be circulated to all parents to help them decide who to vote for if an election is needed. You do not have to complete this section, but if you don't you may put yourself at a disadvantage if there is an election.

An election, by secret ballot, will be held if more nominations are received than the number of vacancies. If an election is needed details of the procedure will be sent to all parents.
