Thank you all for your feedback to the parent survey. We had 159 responses. Thank you for the many positive comments, particularly around the support that your child receives. The main area that came through to develop further was communication, and it was pleasing to see how many of you were interested in finding out more about working with the school to develop our parent partnership. Mrs. Dunn will be sending out more details of how to get involved soon.

The key themes from the feedback were:

- Increase visibility and understanding of progress
- Enhance partnership and engagement

Next Friday is Holocaust Memorial Day and the following week students will have assemblies led by our Sixth Form Students who recently visited Auschwitz. It is a time of reflection that we hold with our students every year. It reminds us to be thankful for what we have, but also of the importance of standing up to any kind of persecution and the dangers that exist if we don't.

The quote at the start of this newsletter was from a book I read recently about Holocaust survivor, Viktor Frankl, the lessons he learned from his time in Auschwitz and how he applied these to his life and the importance of meaning. This was not a big picture view but very much about taking a strong attitude toward unavoidable suffering. Frankl goes on to discuss why it is important to nourish one's inner freedom, embrace the value of beauty in nature, art, poetry, and literature, and feel love for family and friends. He encouraged activities, relationships, and hobbies and noted that even simple pleasures can also give meaning to life.
